


Pakistan: Humanitarian Crisis Persists (As of June 5, 2009)

- May 20** • UNOCHA reports nearly 1.8 million new IDPs since GOP began its offensive against the Taliban on April 26. Vast majority sheltering outside of camps, with host families or in spontaneous settlements.
- May 24-26** • Reports of some IDPs leaving South Waziristan (FATA) in anticipation of major military operations. World Food Program distributes 45,000 MT of food to IDPs in NWFP.
- May 28** • Taliban sets off two bombs in Peshawar, and one in Dera Ismail Khan. ICRC suspends activity in Swat due to security risks. Reports of militants laying landmines in North and South Waziristan.
- May 30-31** • Pakistani military declares victory over Taliban in Mingaora, Swat. GOP makes plans to release 25,000 rupees (\$312) to each IDP family. Parts of Buner deemed safe for returns.
- June 1** • Pakistani military lifts curfews in seven towns in Swat District to allow trapped civilians to search for food and supplies. Estimates indicate that between 10,000 and 40,000 individuals remain in Mingaora.
- June 2** • UNHCR and GOP recounting registered IDPs; revised estimate expected to be near 2.3 million people. Ninety-two percent of IDP population continues to shelter outside of camps.
- June 3** • According to WHO, IDPs have limited access to drinking water, sanitation and hygiene facilities; a quarter of the population is affected by diarrhea. Drugs and medical supplies for IDPs are low.
- June 4-5** • According to a Pakistani NGO, Taliban militants destroyed at least 220 schools in Swat District during the recent fighting. UNHCR reports an estimated 20,000 additional people currently fleeing Swat.



GOP Grant of Rs. 25,000 (\$312) Could Buy 3 Months of Food*




